

Broome Bushland Under Threat

The Port of Broome is proposing to develop 62 hectares of bushland next to Reddell Beach. If approved this important corridor and habitat which supports the Northern Brushtail Possum, gubbinge trees (the fruits of which have the highest vitamin C content of any fruit in the world and are important bushtucker), birds and reptiles would be bulldozed to make room for heavy industry supporting the oil and gas industry.

This area of land is currently zoned an Environmental and Cultural Corridor and according to the Shire's Town Planning Scheme these reserves are intended as major open spaces within the town which provide:

- a. fauna and flora habitats
- b. aboriginal heritage and cultural areas
- c. major drainage or aquifer recharge areas
- d. outdoor public recreation and
- e. conservation of the natural environment
